<u>Season of the Church Year ~ Easter</u>: Today (April 12th) we celebrate the Resurrection of Our Lord, which begins the fifty days of the Easter Season, leading up to the Feast of Pentecost.

Hymns or Canticles for this week: LSB 458, 467, 487, 941.

<u>Psalms</u>: Use the psalms for Easter in the chart at LSB 304. The psalms are found in the front of the hymnal (LSB 1-150).

<u>Scripture Readings</u>: The Daily Lectionary for Holy Week can be found at LSB 300.

<u>Small Catechism</u>: Suggestions for this week include: The First Commandment & meaning (LSB 321), The Close of the Commandments & meaning (LSB 322), the Second Article of the Creed and its meaning (LSB 322), the Third Petition of the Lord's Prayer (LSB 324), the Third part of the Sacrament of Holy Baptism (LSB 325), "*How can bodily eating* ..." from the Sacrament of the Altar (LSB 327), and Luther's Morning and Evening Prayers (LSB 327).

Apostles' Creed & Lord's Prayer can be found on the inside back cover of LSB.

<u>Prayers</u>: Ask for family prayer requests. You may make use of the prayers in LSB (305-318). Also take note of the framework for prayer emphasis for each day of the week at LSB 294.
